Tip: PSHSA guidance documents titled for specific sectors, BUT are applicable more broadly; depends on what organizations DO so consider activities of your organization, not just follow by document title

Arts and culture- e.g. performing centres, workshop spaces <u>Entertainment, museum and gallery; Library</u>

Childcare: Childcare centres

Community services, social services- may cover shared spaces and hubs (may also want to use social and community services)

Faith-based: Faith spaces

Nonprofit housing

E.g. Consider congregate setting, scheduling shared amenities; office serving residents

- Home care and community services
- Social and community services

Shared spaces/community hubs (e.g. not public facing but different organizations in one building; rent space for meetings)- office settings one, social and community services- Allied Health document (people coming in and getting a type of service- although not registered body such as massage therapist, but still the same considerations)

Sports- indoor and outdoor- look at <u>Parks & Rec</u> (municipal guidelines may be helpful; to be released shortly)

- 3. Return to Work Roadmap
- 4. Guidance documents
- 5. Duty to report
